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Introduction

You must have a kit that includes a box? Well these are the instructions for assembling it.

My advice is to always double check the fit of the parts BEFORE you glue them together. Once you're sure you have the right parts in the right places use just a little dab of glue to hold things together.

Parts List

In your kit you should have:

		Description	Qty
1.		Box Top with Shrimpware logo	1
2.		Box Base, looks like the top piece, but no logo	1
3.		Box Base Sides, these are the thicker	6
4.		Box Top Sides, these are the slimmer ones	6
5.		Hinges	2
6.		Screws	4

You Will Need to Supply

- wood glue and toothpick to spread it
- small screw driver
- some heavy weights (a couple of 2L bottles of soda will do the trick)
- 4 bar clamps, if you have them

Tools You Will Need

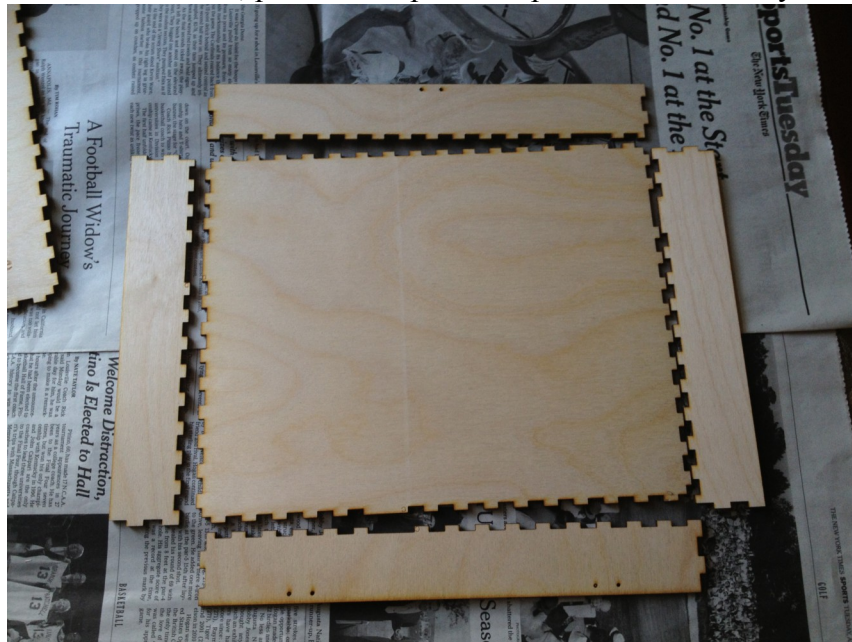
- Hopefully none.

Step 1 Assemble the bottom of the box

First layout the pieces so that you can see how they will fit together. Notice that the bottom piece has a longer notch cut on each side. Look closely and you'll see a small letter etched near each of these bigger notches. Now look at each side piece and you'll see small letters etched on them as well. Lay the



pieces on the table with the etched letters facing up. The letters give you a clue on which pieces go where. When you have it all laid out, put the side pieces in place to make sure you see how they all fit



together. Now lay them back on the table again.

Pour out a little wood glue onto a piece of paper. On the bottom piece dab a little bit of glue on each of the fingers. Now put a little glue on the tab ends of each of the side pieces. Assemble the side pieces, using your fingers to push them into place.

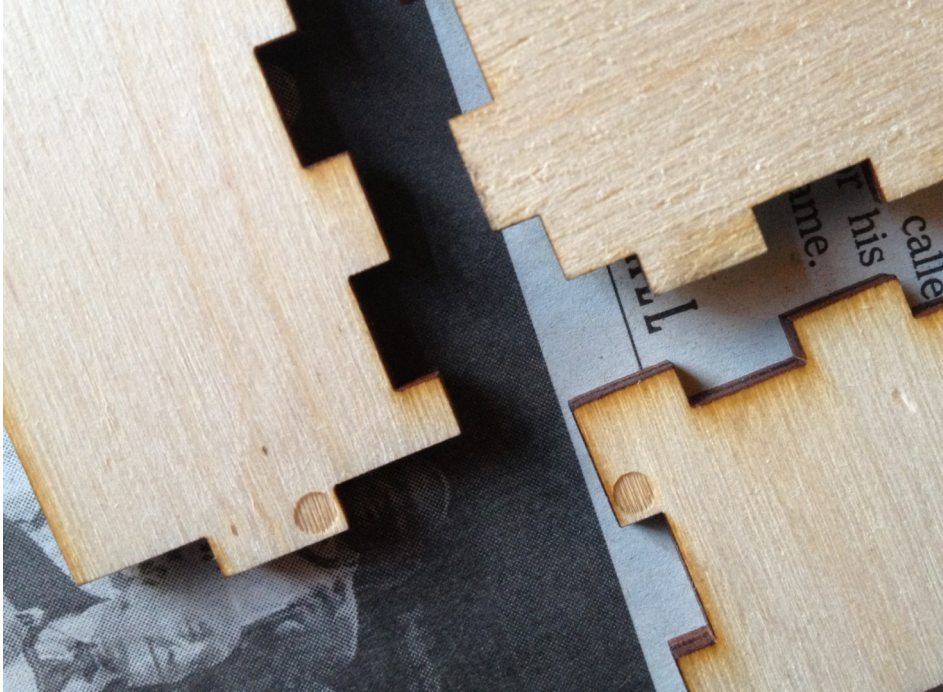


Carefully invert the box on a flat surface and place some heavy weights on top. Press the sides in again to make sure they mate closely with the box bottom and with each other. If you happen to have 4 bar clamps you can apply them to hold the sides in tight. Let the assembly dry.



Step 2 Assemble the top of the box

Layout the pieces of the top with the logo side down. Notice that the ends of each of the sides pieces has a small symbol etched on it – triangle, square, oval, circle. Place the pieces so that like symbols are together. Now rotate the top piece until the longer notches line up with the side pieces.



The assembly of the top is done the same way you did the bottom. Dab a little glue on each tab and put the sides in place.

Invert the top on a flat surface and put heavy weights on it. Press the sides in again to make sure they all fit closely to the top piece. Let it dry.

Step 3 Add additional interior panels

You have 2 additional pieces for the top and the bottom. These pieces go on the inside of the box to reinforce the sides with the hole for the hinges and the clasp.

Hand fit each piece so you feel how they go together. If you have any stray glue from the last steps you may have to scrape it off to get this new pieces to fit.

One at a time, dab glue on each place and press it into place. Hold it until the glue sets, or use those handy clamps!

Step 4 Add the hinges

Find the side of the top and bottom with four holes in each. Place these sides together. Use the screws to attach the hinges.
